## Ex-U. S. Bomber Pilot— On Sit-Down Strike As First Citizen of UN on Paris Steps

Paris, Sept. 12.—(P)—Garry Davis pranked himself at a United Nations building here today in a bid to become the first UN "citizen of the world."

The former U. S. bomber pilot, 26, renounced his American citizenship May 25. The French government ordered him to quit its territory by midnight Saturday. He sat and talked to newsmen today on the wooden steps leading to the temporary administration building being completed for the UN meeting here September 21.

"The United Nations," he said, "is in the half-world between a collection of sovereign nations and a real international authority. I want it to take a stand, so that others can have a chance to acquire international citizenship and open the way for a federated world."

Davis is the son of an American orchestra leader, Meyer Davis.

France has ceded the Palais de Cahillot as international territory for the UN meeting. Technically it is not a part of France.

A high representative of the UN secretariat in Paris later said Davis may not come inside, but will not be chased from the front steps.
